

Stand Up Forklift Attachments

Attachments for Stand Up Forklift - The internal combustion engine powered lift trucks are fittingly labeled to the fuel kind used. Type "G" lift trucks are fueled by gasoline. These meet fire hazard minimum standards and is the most widespread designation for gas powered lift trucks. Trucks labeled "G" are not used in dangerous locations for apparent reasons. Type "GS" forklifts are fueled by gasoline and meet all the requirements of a Type "G" lift truck and have different devices installed to the electrical and fuel and exhaust system to be able to allow them to be utilized in some unsafe places. Type "GS" lift trucks are used in similar applications to Type "EE" electric trucks.

Type "LP" forklifts are fueled by LPG and do satisfy the minimum standard for fire hazards. This is the most widespread designation found on lift trucks fueled by gasoline. The lift trucks labeled "LP" are not utilized in hazardous places. Type "LPS" lift trucks are LPG fueled and meet all standards of a Type "G" truck. They have various pieces of machines set up to the fuel system, exhaust system and electrical system in order to allow them to be used in some dangerous applications. Type "LPS" forklifts are utilized in similar applications to Type "GS" and Type "EE" electric forklifts.

As dual fuel units, the "G/LP" lift trucks may be operated on either gasoline or LPG. These forklifts are not to be utilized in hazardous sites, yet satisfy minimum standards for fire hazards. Type "GS/LPS" trucks are dual fuel units as they may be operated on gasoline or LPG without any modification to the fuel system. These lift trucks satisfy all of the requirements of a Type "GS" or Type "LPS" truck and have different machines installed to their fuel system, exhaust system and electrical system, so as to allow them to be utilized in certain unsafe applications. Type "GS/LPS" trucks are used in similar applications to Type "GS", Type "LPS" and Type "EE" electric lift trucks.

Lift trucks fueled by diesel which meet minimum standards for fire hazards are labeled type "D". These lift trucks are not to be utilized in unsafe places. Type "DS" forklifts are diesel fueled and meet all the requirements of a Type "D" truck and include other machinery installed to the exhaust system, electrical system and fuel system in order to allow them to be utilized in certain hazardous places. Type "DS" lift trucks are used in related applications to Type "GS", Type "LPS" and Type "EE" electric trucks. Type "DY" lift trucks are diesel fueled and meet all the requirements of Type "DS" trucks and also do not have whichever electrical machines installed. These utilize air starters and comprise provisions for regulating the temperature of truck components. These type lift trucks are utilized in similar application to the Type "EE" electric trucks.
